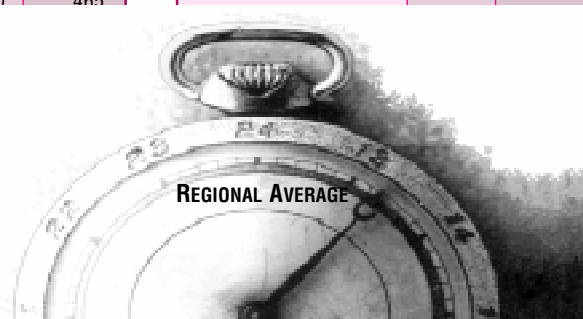


Countries with 1990 starting point above average. Countries with 1990 starting point below average.
